This year, three types of flu vaccine will be used in the flu programme. This will benefit patients by ensuring that they have the most suitable vaccine that gives them the best protection against flu. The three vaccines are:

o **Adjuvanted trivalent flu vaccine (aTIV)** - This is licensed for people aged 65 years and over and is the vaccine recommended by the Joint Committee on Vaccination and Immunisations (JCVI) for this age group. The deliveries of aTIV to practices and pharmacies will be staged between September and early November.

It is appropriate to offer aTIV “off label” to those having their 65th birthday before 31st March 2019 and who are thus eligible to receive influenza vaccine under the current definition of the ‘over 65’ group.

o **Quadrivalent vaccine (QIV)** - This is recommended for children aged from 6 months to 2 years and in adults from 18 years to less than 65 years of age who are at increased risk from flu because of a long term health condition.

In general practice and via school based programmes:

o **Live attenuated influenza vaccine (LAIV)** - This is a nasal spray and is licensed for children and young people from 2 years old to less than 18 years of age. The age groups targeted in England for this vaccine in 2018/19 are two and three year olds (through their GP surgery) and school aged children in reception class through to Year 5 (through schools). If LAIV is clinically contraindicated QIV is used in this age group.
