HEARING LOOP

This is located at Reception in Old Hall Surgery. Please ask if you need help with using it for your consultation.

TEXT MESSAGE SERVICE

Please ask at reception to sign up for this service. We require an up to date mobile number to register you.

Please note: this service is for anyone over the age of 16.

We cannot accept the same mobile number for more than 1 person to use this service due to confidentiality.

TOUCH SCREEN SYSTEM

Reception has become increasingly busy dealing with complex enquiries – if you are just booking in for an appointment with the Doctor, Practice Nurse or Blood tests, please use the touch screen.

HOLIDAY VACCINATIONS

Please arrange a Telephone Consultation with the Practice Nurse who will discuss what injections are needed for your holiday abroad; they will also inform you if there are any charges. An appointment will then be made for you to have them.

ORDERING OF REPEAT MEDICATIONS

This service has not changed; we still require 48 hour's notice when ordering your repeat medication.

You don't need to waste a telephone assessment with a GP just for repeat medication requests.

We still do not except medication requests over the telephone and we ask that you **DON'T LEAVE ORDERING TILL LAST MINUTE**.

ELECTRONIC PRESCRIBING SERVICE

You can still nominate your preferred pharmacy to use this service – just mention it to the Receptionist when you next collect your prescription, this will be updated on your record and the next time you order your prescription, it will be sent electronically to that pharmacy – you do not need to attend the surgery to collect the green FP10 form.

Please note: you cannot use this service if you are on a controlled drug. This will still be printed out and will either need collecting by yourself or pharmacy if you have requested them to do so.

PRESCRIPTIONS AND APPOINTMENTS

We now have the on-line access in place for both prescriptions and appointments.

FOR ORDERING PRESCRIPTIONS

You need to download the App. Type in https://patient.emisaccess.co.uk from your device of choice. This will bring up the page but advises you this is only available to be used in desktop. You need to choose the desktop mode (right hand side of page) select desktop version and you will view it as if on a laptop.

PILL / DEPO-PROVERA CHECKS

Please book in with the Practice Nurse to have these checks, we can book up to 4 months in advance for Nurse Appointments. Do not waste a Doctor's telephone call for a prescription as we need to do the necessary checks in the surgery.

NHS PRESCRIPTION CHARGES

From 1st April 2014, NHS prescription charges in England will rise from £7.85 to £8.05 for each quantity of drug/appliance dispensed. Prescriptions pre-payment certificates (PPC) will remain the same at £29.10 for a 3 month certificate and £104 for an annual certificate. If patients are not exempt from prescription charges, PPC's offer savings for those requiring 4 or more items in 3 months or 13 or more items in any one year.

PNEUMONIA VACCINATION

At this time we will also be offering a Pneumonia vaccination (Pneumovax) if you haven't already had one.

SHINGLES VACCINATION

If you are <u>aged 70</u> or <u>aged 79</u> now and not received this vaccination please can you book in to see the Practice Nurse before 31st August 2014. You will not be eligible to receive this vaccination after this date.

If you are, or were **70 years old** on the 1st September or **aged 79 and 78**, you will be offered this vaccination. Please book an appointment at Reception.

TEMPORARY RESIDENTS IN THE AREA

Are you visiting the area on holiday or are staying with relatives for a few days, then we can see you here on a temporary basis if you are unwell.

Please make sure you have your GP details available and photo id with you.

Please note: If you live in Chester, Hooton, Neston or Eastham you will not be able to see our GP's as you are in travelling distance to visit your own GP.

ACCU-CHEK BLOOD MONITOR MACHINE

You do not need to change your blood monitoring machine.

If you are having problems, please make an appointment with the Practice Nurse making sure you bring your machine and strips with you to the appointment and they will go through the new procedure with you.

HEALTH SCREENING CHECKS

Don't forget to bring a urine sample with you if you are having a health screen check. This is to test for sugar.



CARERS

Doctors in the area are being encouraged to identify carers and help them receive necessary support.

A carer is a person of any age, adult or child, who provides unpaid support to a partner, child, relative, or friend, who could live independently, or whose health or wellbeing would deteriorate without this help.

This could be due to frailty, disability, or a serious health condition, mental health or substance misuse.

CHESHIRE CONSTABULARY - 101 SERVICE

This is the Police non-emergency number.

You should use this number to report less urgent crime or disorder, or to contact the police with general enquiries or to speak to a local officer.

For example:

- If your car has been stolen
- If your property has been damaged
- Reporting a minor traffic incident
- Where you suspect drug use or dealing
- Giving police information about a crime in your area

How does it work?

You can call 101 to contact Cheshire Police 24 hours a day, 7 days a week.

How much does it cost?

Calls from landlines and mobile networks cost 15 pence per call, no matter what time of day or how long you are on the phone.

Please always call 999 in an emergency where there is a threat to life or a crime in progress.
